Sindile Leopard Protection Projects

Leopards are considered the most resilient of all large feline species. Unfortunately, for African leopards, natural habitats and food sources are under threat due to increased land development and agricultural stock farmer conflict.



Saving Leopards:

- Leopards found in problematic environments need to be carefully captured and moved to a safe habitat as quickly as possible. Before re-releasing into the wild, leopards have to be habituated to electric fences to prevent escapes from new reserves that might lead to further conflict with small stock farmers.

What is Needed:

- Non-lethal trapping devices to ensure the safe capture and comfort of the leopard.
- Pre-release enclosures especially designed with electric fencing and large enough for natural movement.
